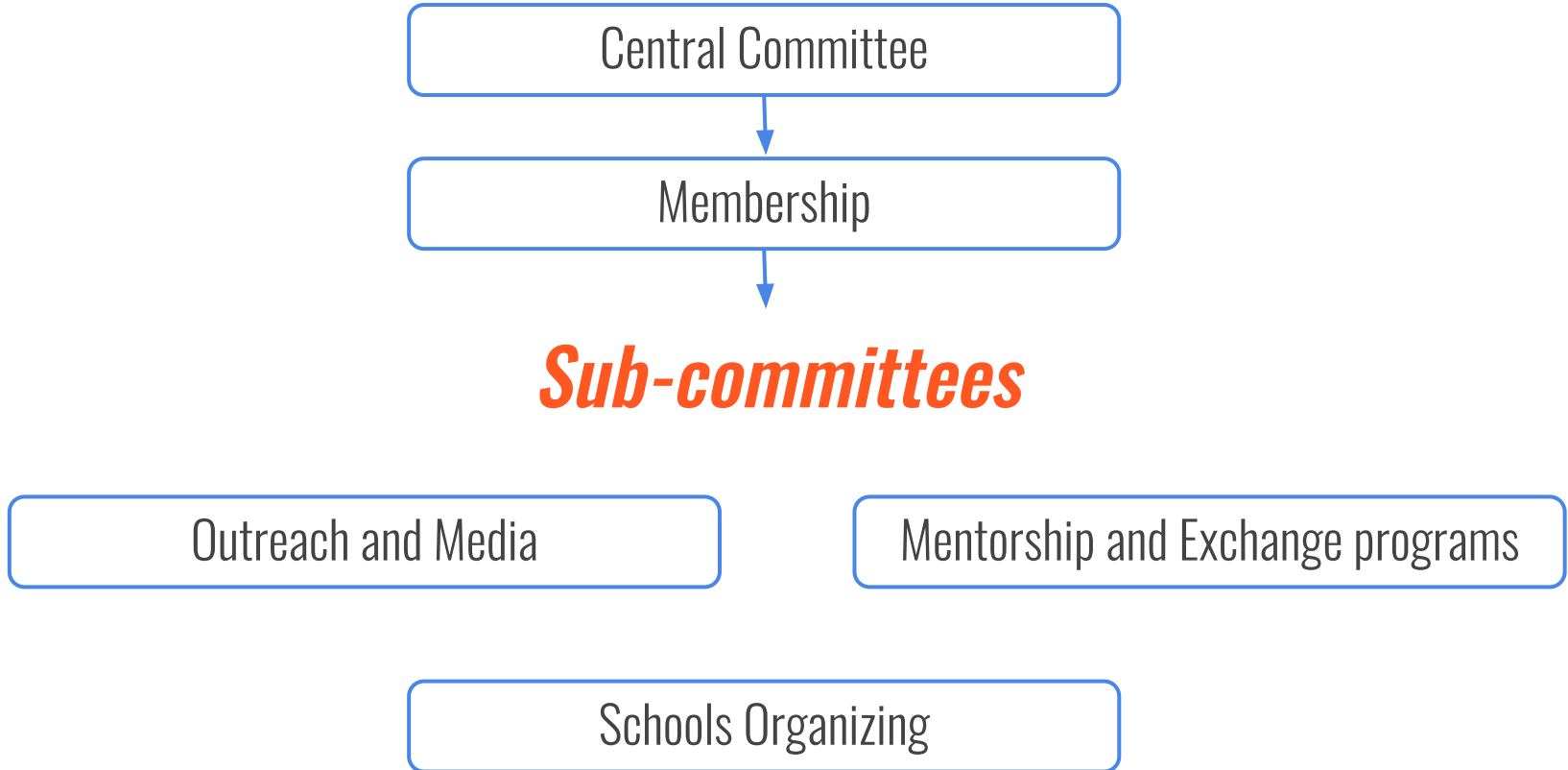

S4P Organizational structures



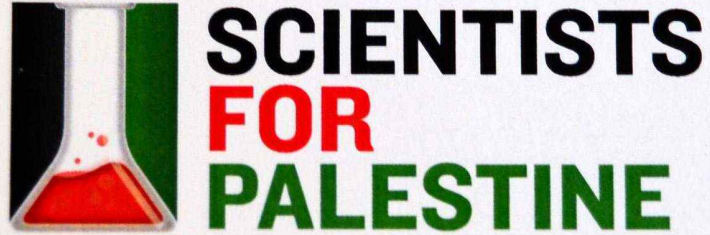

Clauses of the constitution defining membership:

Qualifications for membership

5. Membership shall be open to anyone holding or working towards an advanced scientific degree, broadly defined, and who agrees with and accepts the objectives and the constitution of the association.
6. Anyone who is directly involved in the occupation of the West Bank and Gaza Strip shall not be eligible for membership.

Application for membership

7. Any person who wishes to become a member must sign and submit an application for membership.
8. The Central Committee may, at its discretion, refuse to admit any person to membership.
9. The Central Committee shall consider each application for membership at the first Central Committee meeting held after receipt of the application; the Central Committee shall, within a reasonable time after the meeting, notify the applicant of its decision on the application.

Membership responsibilities

10. No membership subscription shall be payable.
11. Members are responsible to notify the association to keep their personal information up to date.
12. Members should act in accordance with and contribute to the objectives and constitution of the association.
13. Members should maintain an ethically responsible conduct both in the association and in society.

Register of members

14. The Central Committee shall maintain a register of members, setting out the full name and contact information of each member, the date on which s/he was admitted to membership, and the date on which any person ceased to be a member.

Withdrawal from membership

15. Any person who wishes to withdraw from membership shall sign, and lodge with the association, a written notice to that effect; on receipt of the notice by the association, s/he shall cease to be a member.

Expulsion from membership

16. Any person may be expelled from membership by
 1. a resolution passed by majority vote at a general meeting (meeting of members), providing the following procedures have been observed:
 1. at least 21 days' notice of the intention to propose the resolution must be given to the member concerned, specifying the grounds for the proposed expulsion;
 2. the member concerned shall be entitled to be heard on the resolution at the general meeting at which the resolution is proposed.
 2. by a majority vote of the Central Committee, with or without notice.
